






## STI CLINICAL CARE

NOVUS Health provides confidential and free sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment. The clinic focuses on prevention and education while providing high-quality care to all individuals. We offer these services by appointment or walk-in.

Free condoms are available. NOVUS Health also coordinates 2 sites for STI testing and treatment—our main office on Lindell Boulevard and NOVUS Health @ University Club Medical in Brentwood.

PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) is a service of our STI clinical care and provides HIV prevention treatment to individuals. There are multiple options for preventative therapy for HIV. Ask the NOVUS Health Prevention Services Coordinator for more details or come in and discuss your options.

### **OUR 2024 GOALS**

• We will begin Opt-Out HIV testing in partnership with WashU. This will allow us to automatically test every patient for HIV with rapid testing, with the option to opt out. This will help lessen the stigma of HIV testing, foster early treatment plans, and reduce the risk of transmission.



### **STI Tests**

Screening and testing are done for the following:

- HIV
- SYPHILIS
- CHLAMYDIA
- GONORREA
- TRICHOMONIASIS
- HERPES SIMPLEX
- 2,645 Chlamydia tests were administered.
  - 7% Received treatment
- 2,696 Gonorrhea tests were administered.
  - 8% Received treatment
- 1,630 Syphilis tests were administered.
  - 8% Received treatment
- 443 Trichomonas tests were administered.
  - 7% Received treatment
- 30 Herpes tests were administered.
- 1,405 HIV tests were administered.
  - Positive tests linked to care

## **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

Behavioral health relates to the connection between your behavior and the health of your mind, body, and spirit. It is the way your habits affect your mental and physical health and wellness.

NOVUS Health provides service opportunities to individuals through:

- Assessment
- One-on-one in person counseling
- Virtual mental health services
- Telehealth psychiatric services
- Group therapy—multiple areas (coming soon)

220 Patients used Behavioral Health services 1,466 times in 2023.

### 2023 Successes

- In September 2023, Dr. Chanel Mitchell submitted application for practicum placement.
- In October of 2023, the behavioral health department officially became an approved practicum location worksite in agreement with UMSL School of Social Work, Brown School (WashU), and SLU.
- Gavyn Stys completed a 5-day program to become EMDR trained.

## **Patient Testimonials**



Patient 1 is blind and lives alone. She has some home nursing assistance she does not feel safe letting new people into her home.

NOVUS provided her with food and a grocery gift card. A staff member talked to her on the phone until the patient was comfortable and then delivered the items and visited for an hour, discussing the food, placing it where the patient could access it, and asking what the patient might need to feel secure in her health and her home.

One NOVUS Health patient requested a Thanksgiving dinner. She said that after being very sick, she is getting better with the help of her NOVUS providers and starting to gain her weight back and the food would be a very big help. She showed us tennis shoes that Food Outreach was able to provide for her, and NOVUS will be able to provide a warm coat. She also thanked us for the books for sale in the lobby. Because of their availability, she has started to enjoy reading again and "feels normal again."

Patient 2 asked for help with Thanksgiving Dinner. Sadly, he then became unhoused and did not have any way to cook. He was able to secure a bed in a shelter, and NOVUS provided him with several options for a cooked Thanksgiving dinner. NOVUS also stepped in and provided him with a warm winter coat, winter boots, and a pair of shoes.



## 2024 GOALS

- INTEGRATION. Continue to promote collaboration and integration of community health workers into clinic/patient care.
- CONNECTION. Establish partnerships with local community organizations and businesses to enhance our presence and collaborative initiatives in our new location.
- ENGAGEMENT. Recruit and engage volunteers to support our organization's mission and increase community outreach.
- ASSESSMENT. Conduct needs assessment, community meetings and forums to address community-specific concerns and tailor outreach efforts.
- IMPACT. Integrate and include outcome metrics to measure the effectiveness and influence of outreach and support services.
- EXPANDED SERVICES. Continue to expand our community reach and through the development of services including an onsite food pantry.

## **HEALTH AND WELLNESS SERVICES**

#### 2023 Successes

2023 was a year filled with success for the NOVUS team. We not only strengthened, but also expanded our medical services. This has helped improve accessibility of care for our patients and allowed us to promote a comprehensive health model. Initiatives that we successfully implemented in 2023 include an introduction of both our telemedicine platform and our Doxy-PEP program. Telemedicine has allowed us to expand our geographic reach, improve access to care for those with health disparities and transportation limitations, and promote flexibility in scheduling of appointments. We completed 49 medical visits via telemedicine, and continue to see an increase in the number of visits each week. This platform has allowed us to offer medical services to patients living in the greater St Louis metropolitan area, as well as those living in Southeast Missouri. Our team was approached to offer medical services to a particular patient in Southeast Missouri who was unable to find a provider to manage her chronic medical needs. She was left with getting refills for her medications from her local emergency department. A recent stroke made transportation to and from the hospital taxing. Through our partnership with case management, we were able to see the patient from the comfort of her own home. We were able to link her with lab studies that were imperative to the provision of quality care. We are committed to ensuring care is accessible for the patients we serve.

Over the course of 2023 we welcomed 305 new patients, a huge increase from 129 new patients the year prior. We continue to look for opportunities to expand the services offered here at NOVUS. Our HIV prevention program continues to expand, which is rooted in both education directives and PrEP services. We provided HIV PrEP services to 181 patients in 2023, up from 109 the year prior. We have expanded PrEP to also include an injectable option for some patients that meet clinical eligibility. In addition to our PrEP services, we also introduced our Doxy-PEP program. We anticipate a reduction in the number of sexually transmitted infections as a result of this initiative. One of our biggest accomplishments in 2023 was initiating rapid HIV screenings at each office visit. We performed 1432 tests, with an average of 119 tests per month. Our process identified 22 new HIV cases and all patients were successfully directed into care. Early detection and initiation of care will help improve health outcomes.

#### 2024 Goals

We have already started working on reaching the goals we have established for 2024. We continue to focus on infection prevention as an initiative to health promotion. We are looking to expand PrEP services by utilizing telemedicine as an additional tool for education and screening. We hope that securing the appropriate resources needed for this, we can continue to expand our reach. We also look to optimally utilize resources available to us. Utilizing the State Lab will allow us to remaining fiscally conscious in the care we provide.

The NOVUS clinical team would like to thank all that have supported them throughout 2023. We are proud of all we have accomplished over the course of last year and are excited about the goals we have set as a team for 2024.

## **Patient Giving**

It has always been in the NOVUS plan to continue to build programs that support the holistic health of our patients and our community. In early 2023 we knew that we wanted to increase our giving to patient families who need help affording food around Thanksgiving and winter holidays. We also knew we wanted to offer everyone the chance to be a part of the giving.

In May, we started the NOVUS Flea Market. Staff members, patients, friends and community members donated items to sell, and we sold them in the lobby, at the Gala, and eventually on Facebook and Ebay. We even took the show on the road and sold in a few local flea markets.

In the fall, we posted surveys and identified 20 families who needed nutritional support over Thanksgiving and Christmas. We kept emergency food and winter accesories stocked in the clinic and were able to provide coats and boots to 13 patients. Also, we were able to provide warm clothing, bedding, food, and toys to the family of a patient who sadly departed right before Thanksgiving, leaving 3 children needing extra love and support. We are certain that we did not reach all the patients who need assistance, but we are proud of our efforts in 2023 to gather community feedback and increase our outreach.

All in all, the Patient Assistance/Flea Market program raised \$3700 in sales and donations from May to December 2023. These sales and donations funded 100% of our giving, and helped seed our Food Pantry program that will begin in 2024 in our new location. The program also allowed us to practice building a program of benevolence on a smaller scale, proved that there is an enthusiastic market for our "stuff", and showed all that our NOVUS community is generous in providing help for others.








